Explanatory Notes:

1. The grades, name of the tournament, and the major placings in a major international tournament are those of the grades of Guo Guang Sports Medals referred to in Article 4 of the amendments to the Regulations Governing the Issuance of Guo Guang Athletic Medals and Scholarships which were issued on September 17, 2015.
2. The names and major placings in the disabled international tournaments are formulated in accordance with Article 3 and Article 5 of the Regulations Governing Elite Disabled Athlete and Their Active Coach Award Initiative.
3. The official competition items of the Olympic Games and the Asian Games are limited to those official competition items approved by the organizers for the most recent Olympic Games and Asian Games, or approved for the next ones.
4. The Grade E competition items may only be submitted for applications if the applicant coached one or more athletes who competed in the sporting event and won a major place.
