Anyone who has the engine engineering or general-level training completion certificate of the Class B crew training class of the domestic crew training institution and has served in the ship cabin for more than two years and six months. 2. One who has served the cabin duties as a deputy craftsman, a starter, a boat crew..., etc for more than three years. 3. After the first-class, second-class and third-class engineering training of the Class A mariner training class of the domestic crew training institution, the company has been issued the certificate of completion. 4. One who has an assistant-level engineer's duty certificate of competency, an assistant-level engineer's duty professional training certificate of qualification or an engineer's duty certificate of qualification, has served as a mechanic for more than six months. 5. Anyone who has served as a sergeant on all types of naval vessels in the naval duty for more than three years, and holds the naval command certificate, and holds the assistant level sailing training certificate or the sailing duty verification certificate. 6. Anyone who has served as a technical officer, police officer or sergeant and above on various types of ship cabins in the coastal patrol agency for more than three years and has obtained the certificate of the assistant-level engineer duty training. 7. Anyone who holds the practicing certificate of the cadre crew of second class chief engineer and above issued by the Agricultural Committee of the Executive Yuan, and has served as a second class chief engineer of a fishing vessel for more than one year, and obtained the certification documents by the fishery government. 8. Graduated from the related marine department engineering group of the public or private junior college, marine, marine vocational schools of engine engineering, engines, engine technology, marine engineering, water police department, water police department engineering group, marine patrol department engineering group..., etc. and received a diploma.

Third Class	1. One who has a deputy navigator exam passing certificate or practicing certificate, and has served as a deputy navigator for more than one year.
Chief Engineer	2. One who has a third-class certificate of competence or a certificate of practice and has served as a third-class engineer for more than one year.
Remark : 1. Those who participate in the third-class officer and third-class engineer promotion training should have a crew service manual issued by the navigational authority. 2. The trainee or assistant qualifications are not counted.
