Excellency:

I have the honor to refer to the recent discussions between representatives of our Government concerning the adjustment of the ceiling on category 6 (ginghams, combed) and the establishment of a specific ceiling for category 25 (yarn-dyed fabrics, except ginghams, combed) under the provisions of the United States-Chinese bilateral agreement concerning trade in cotton textiles, done at Taipei on October 19, 1963, as amended.

I am pleased to inform you that the Governments of the United States agrees to the increase of the export ceiling for category 6 from the present level of 377,784 square yards to a new level of 600,000 square yards for the second year of the agreement commencing October 1, 1964. The United States Government also agrees to establish a ceiling of 750,000 square yards for category 25 for the second year of the agreement. These ceilings would, of course, be subject to the provisions of paragraphs 1 and 2 of the agreement with respect to overall and group ceilings and to the provisions of paragraph 6 of the agreement in regard to growth during ensuing twelve-month periods.

If these proposals are acceptable to your Government, this note and Your Excellency's note in reply on behalf of the Government of the Republic of China shall constitute an amendment to the agreement of October 19, 1963.

Accept, Excellency, the renewed assurances of my highest consideration.

I have the honor to confirm on behalf of the Government of the Republic of China that this amendment to the bilateral arrangement is acceptable and that your Excellency's note and this note in reply shall constitute an agreement between our Governments.
