

Attachment 2 to Article 3

1. For partly government-paid home-care placement, if the number of applicants to live in the veterans' home exceeds the accommodation capacity, the order of placement will be determined in accordance with the period of service, current age and military rank at the time of discharge.
2. Calculation Method:
 - (1) Period of Service: (representing 40%)
 1. 10 years of military service is equal to 10 points. Each additional year earns 1 additional point, up to a maximum of 40 points (see Table 1).
 2. The period of service shall be based on the record in the "List of Retired and Discharged Servicemen or List of Retirement/Discharge Payment" as approved by the Ministry of National Defense or each command headquarters. Otherwise the period is to be 10 years.
 3. If there is no record showing the period of service, an official order or letter issued by the Deputy Chief of the General Staff of Personnel of the Ministry of National Defense or each command headquarters showing the period of service is also acceptable. The VAC is not responsible for verifying such a letter or seeking any document of proof.
 - (2) Age: (representing 30%)
 1. An age of 65 is equal to 10 points. Each additional year earns 1 additional point. Starting from 76 years old, each additional year earns 2 additional points, up to a maximum of 30 points (Table 2).
 2. The age shall be calculated based on the military registered age. In the case of any change of age approved by the military, the changed age shall be used as the basis.
 - (3) Military Ranking at the Time of Discharge: (representing 30%)
 1. The rank of corporal has the highest amount of 30 points with 30. Lieutenant-general has the lowest amount of points of 1 point (Table 3).
 2. Military ranking shall be calculated based on the level recorded in the discharge order (or relevant document).
3. Comparison and Order:
 - (1) Points from period of service, age and military ranking at the time of discharge are accumulated, up to a maximum of 100 points. Points are ranked in order. The person with more points receives higher priority placement.
 - (2) Points under a single item will not be compared. When two or more persons have the same number of points, the person with the older age will receive higher priority placement.
